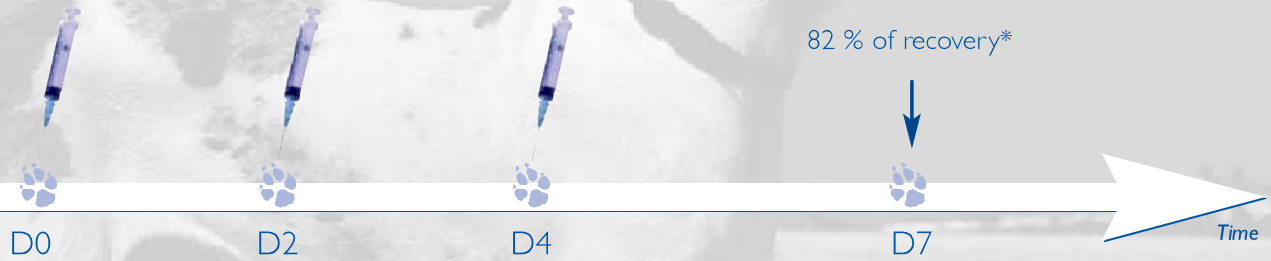


Protocol

Canine Distemper: Feline Omega Interferon Protocol

Treatment in acute phase

Feline omega interferon
2 MU/dog – 3 injections eod, SC (or IV)
+ Symptomatic treatment



Individual sick dog should receive appropriate symptomatic treatment

BENEFITS:

- Reduced clinical signs
- Quick recovery when treatment is started early

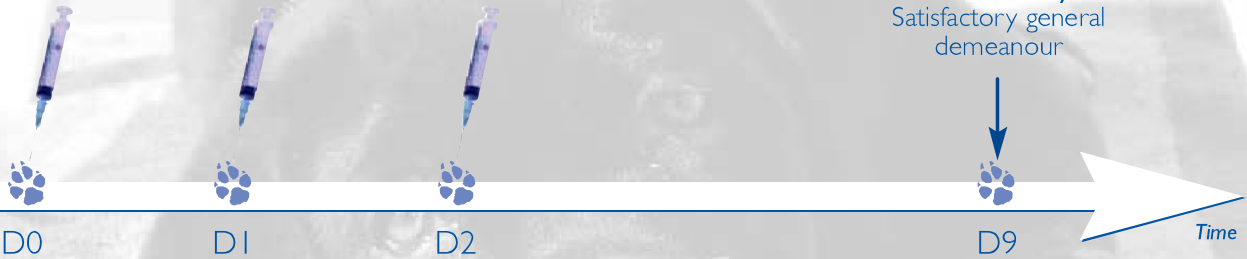

Protocol

Canine Parvovirus Infection: Feline Omega Interferon Protocol

➡ Feline omega interferon is a **PRIMARY TREATMENT**

As soon as possible: feline omega interferon
2,5 MU/Kg/day, IV for 3 consecutive days
+ Symptomatic treatment



Symptomatic treatment is **essential**
(fluid therapy, antibiotics,
anti-emetics, protectants...)

- BENEFITS:**
- Reduced mortality
 - Better and quicker remission
